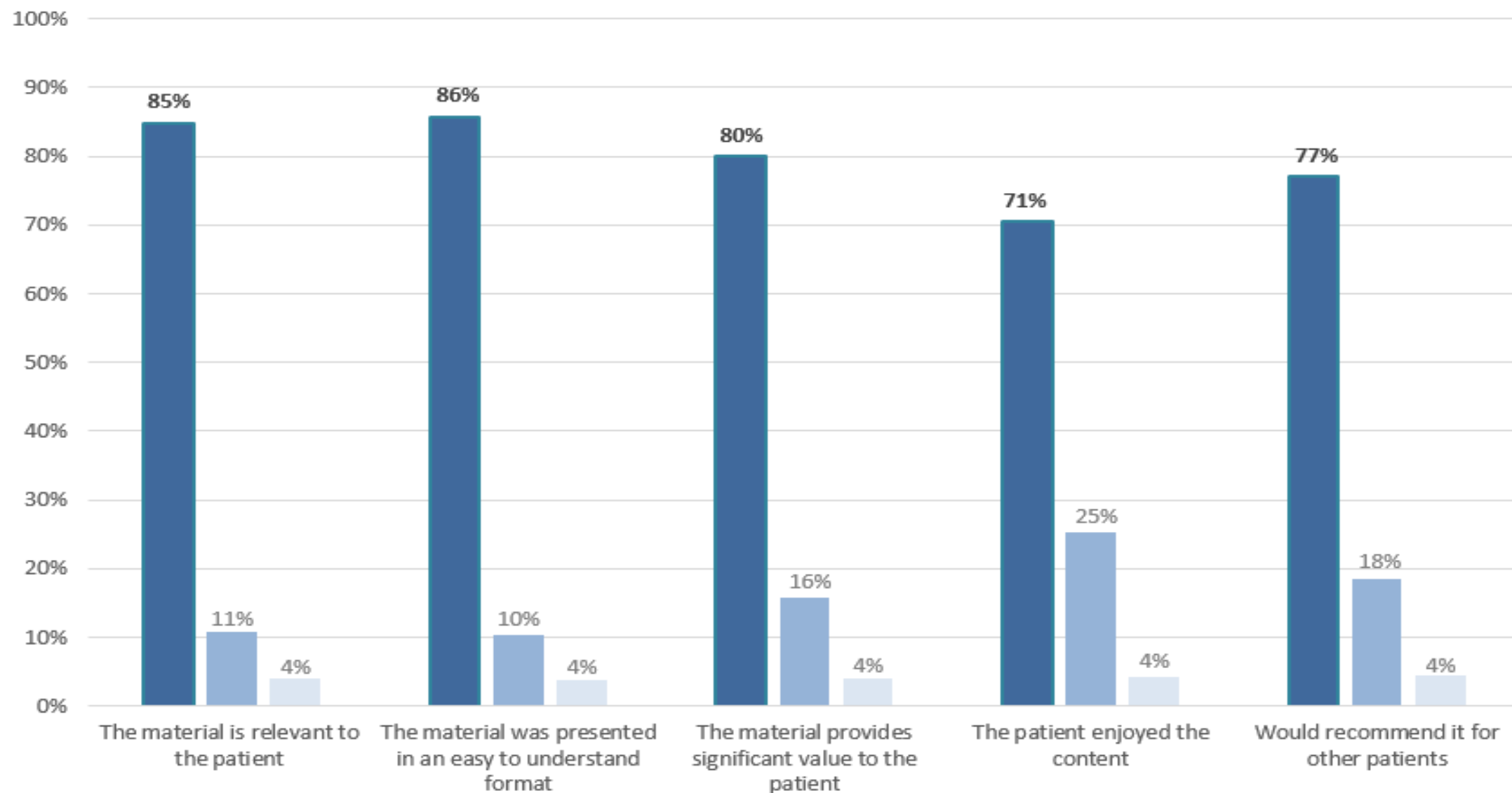
Feb – September 2019
